Part A: Review of Fiji Self-Assessment Process



- **Ancestral "iTaukei" culture** persists for ~ 45% of Fijians. Decision-making via consensus, with Ministry iTaukei Affairs. 90% land by individuals or clans.
- R-Package consultations & emerging REDD+ strategy build on iTaukei customary cultural, land tenure and land use practices -- unique proposal.
- Self-assessment process December 2018 to mid-February 2019. National R-Package validation workshop January 28, 2019 in Suva, the capital.
- **20 criteria green**, **12 yellow** (collectively 94%), Fiji self-assessment: 2 orange

13 green, . TAP assessment:

15 yellow,

6 orange

Part B: Summary of the REDD+ Process: 1

- Component 1: Readiness Organization and Consultation:
 - 1a. Readiness Management Arrangement:
 - Self-assessment process included most key stakeholders; and was a well-managed process overall.
 - But: Ministry Forestry & REDD+ Unit need to: a) share program studies; b) get Unit's website running; c) produce ~12 short policy papers summarizing key study results.
 - Improve procurement & disbursement of funding capacity and performance.
 - 1b. Stakeholder Consultation:

<mark>Fiji</mark>. <mark>TAP</mark>. (even split*,* 50/50)

Fiji. TAP

- Weak information dissemination to the communities.
- Need to continue decentralization of knowledge about and funding for REDD+ program to the Divisions (the field).

Summary of the REDD+ Process: 2

- **Component 2: REDD+ Strategy:**
 - 2a. Assessment of Land Use, Policy, Governance
 - **Cost-benefit analysis of REDD+ strategic options** via a consultancy not yet available.
 - Studies on tenure and Drivers . . . But need to finalize and publish studies (eg, carbon rights) to advance regulations needed.
 - **2b. REDD Strategy**
 - But: REDD+ Strategy needs to be finalized and published.
 - **2c. Implementation Framework:**
 - Legislative and regulatory reforms need to be finished.
 - Benefit Sharing mechanism & National Registry need to be completed.

Summary of the REDD+ Processes: 3

- 2d. Social and Environmental Impacts Fiji. TAP
- SESA and ESMF both only in draft and not publicly available. Not summarized in the report.
- But: World Bank work wrapping up.
- Benefit Sharing framework is under development. 5 options for benefit sharing under consideration.
- BS is likely to be strength of Fiji, as builds on BS practices in iTaukei traditional society.



Summary of the REDD+ Processes: 4

• Component 3: Reference Level

Fiji. TAP

- National FRL under development meets IPCC and FCPF Meth. Framework guidance.
- But: Review of excluded LU activities and sources needed re significance over 10% of emissions): fire, fuelwood, slash and burn agriculture.
- Component 4: Monitoring Systems for forests, and safeguards
 - 4a. National forest monitoring system.
 - Solid work developing and testing proposed MRV system at the national and Division levels.
 - Institutional capacity inadequate, but is being revitalized.
 - 4b. System of information on safeguards.
 - Information system on multiple benefits and safeguards and Safeguard Information System barely started and requires significant work.

C. Summary of Assessment and Recommendation: 1

Strengths:

- 90% of lands in country involved
- Builds on iTaukei customary cultural, land tenure and land use practices -- unique proposal. Could be major diversity contribution to the CF's portfolio.
- Consultation process robust, tho needs some additional stakeholders & improved communication of results of studies and processes.
- Strong FRL and MRV development underway.
- Fiji advanced to submitting ER-PD (under FCPF review).

Summary and Recommendation: 2

Areas needing further work:

- Self-assessment: TAP finds 14 criteria lower scores . . .
- Enhanced internal coordination among team critical at this stage, to achieve Readiness and produce a competitive ER-PD.
- Building capacity: a few strong experts in each key agency, but need depth there and in Divisions and CSOs.
- **Safeguards:** SESA and ESMF need to be completed.
- Transparency: Web site up, policy summaries of key documents and processes shared.
